

2010 National Physician Survey (NPS) – MEDICAL RESIDENTS:

Source of Data:

The Medical Resident component of the 2010 National Physician Survey (NPS) was carried out as a self-reported online survey, sent to all medical residents in Canada from September to November 2010. The NPS email list was generated through the postgraduate departments at each of the 17 Canadian medical schools. To protect privacy and confidentiality, correspondence relating to the NPS was forwarded through the postgraduate departments to all current medical residents within their school, including the requests to complete the online NPS questionnaire. Two versions of the questionnaire were completed – one by family medicine residents and one by other specialty medicine residents.

Level of detail at which Medical Resident results from the National Physician Survey will be released:

To ensure the release of valid and stable results, results will only be released where the group/ 'cohort' of interest has a minimum of 30 respondents. Medical Resident NPS results will be posted to the NPS website at the national level by family medicine residents and specialty medicine residents. Data on select questions will also be posted by year of residency for family medicine and other specialty residents. Data for selected questions will be posted by year of residency.

Medical Resident Response Rates:

TOTAL POPULATION – For the Total Population column, information was provided by the postgraduate department at each of the 17 Canadian medical schools.

MEDICAL SCHOOL – For the Total Population column, 'medical school' was extracted from the counts provided by the postgraduate departments at each medical school. For the NPS Respondents column, the NPS questionnaire asked: at which university are you currently doing your medical residency training.
